### Pastor's CORDER NOTE

Is Love sustainable, others of us have asked from time to time. It seems that everyone wants some of it but not many really know what true Love is, nor do they know where someone may receive it.

Love is one of those intrinsic things that everyone desires, because the simple fact is, we are born to have it. Yet you may not be able to define it or even recognize it if you see it. If Love never fails, then I wish to choose that for those whom I take an active role in assisting in their life long choice. <u>Love is patient</u>: (able to remain calm and not become annoyed when waiting for a long time or when dealing with problems or even difficult people). <u>Love is kind</u>: (a

group of people or things that belong together or have some shared quality: a particular type or variety of person or thing). Kindness is more than an attitude, it is a similarity they are of similar kind. Male and Female but both honoring of God, holding to the same priorities and values, not unequally put together. <u>It does not envy:</u> (painful or resentful awareness of an advantage enjoyed by another). If there is ever a situation that does not seem right to you or you feel your deacons are not handling something properly (wherever there are people, I find problems do come up... •• ) be sure to give your deacon an opportunity to respond and make things right.

I know just in my house employing these scriptural truths can make a big difference in resolving conflict with reality and in love. And the best part is you are set free from that "conflict".
