In the 6^{th} century, Christians had linked what is today referred to as the Season of Advent to the coming of Christ. But not his first coming in the manger in Bethlehem, but his second coming which will take place in the clouds as the judge of the world. As the angels had told his disciples that he will return just as you see him leaving.

Acts 1:11, "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

Today, the Advent season lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. Advent begins on the Sunday that falls between November 27th and December 3rd each year, this year it will be Dec. 6th.)

Advent symbolizes the present situation of the church in these "last days", as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to perfect his eternal kingdom. Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his bride.

I have asked many times lately what you are expecting: are you as the people in Noah's day expecting for things to just continue as they seemingly always have to short sited individual, or are you more like Simeon in <u>Luke</u>


2: 25, "Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation (relief from grief) of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah (defender, liberator, savior champion or guardian)."

We are meant to be longing for relief from the ever-increasing grief that even has the earth itself moaning and heaving for the coming of our Lord. I have witnessed expectant graduates groan with anticipation of the upcoming celebration as well, brides, declaring nothing better get in the way of their impending nuptials.

By now, you have probably already been contacted by your new Deacons. Last week, these Deacons prepared, assembled & delivered Thanksgiving meals to BBC families.

While 2020 has been a challenging year for us, God is still on His throne and Jesus Christ reigns as our Lord & Savior. "The virgin will be with child & will bring forth a son, and they will call Him, Immanuel which means God with us." (Matthew 1:23).

As we journey to Bethlehem to worship the Christ child, we prepare our hearts for the nativity of Jesus Christ during the Advent season. It is also a time to reflect on the triumphant return of Jesus at the second coming. Advent is Latin meaning something new is coming as God incarnate breaks through time & space to enter our world. The Advent wreath signifies continuous life, a circle with no beginning or end symbolizing the eternity of God, immortality of the soul, and everlasting life in Jesus Christ. The 4 candles on the Advent wreath are lighted one each Sunday. The Hope Candle is the Prophecy Candle in remembrance of the prophets (Isaiah 53) who foretold the birth of Christ, and represents anticipation for the coming Messiah. The Faith Candle is the Bethlehem Candle as a reminder of Mary & Joseph's journey to Bethlehem and their faith in following God's will (Luke 2:4-7). The Joy Candle is the Shepherds' Candle symbolizing their joy at the news of the birth of Jesus & our joy for God's matchless gift to humanity (Luke 2:8-12). The Peace Candle is the Angels' Candle and reminds us of the angels' message "Peace on earth, good will towards men." (Luke 2:13-14).

O come let us adore Him. May we always keep Christ in Christmas.
