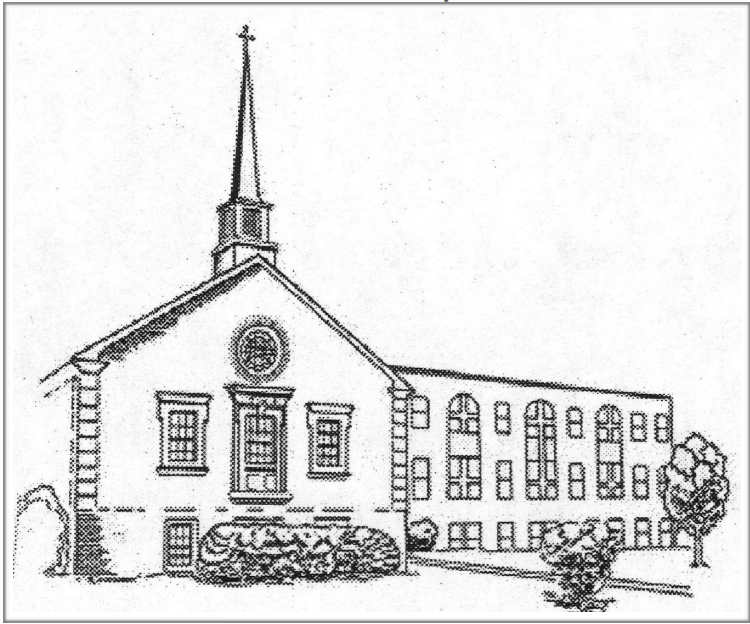

This first Sunday of November will find the adult and young adult Sunday school classes studying the last four lessons of the Fall 2017 quarter. These last four lessons will be from the book of Leviticus. “The book of Exodus ended with the tabernacle being filled with the glory of the Lord. God's glory was so powerful that Moses could not enter the tent of meeting. This reality highlighted the vast contrast between God and humanity. Inside the new tabernacle, offering sacrifices would be a frequent activity. These sacrifices were designed to teach worshipers how to maintain a covenant relationship with God.”

Session 10 Set Before-- God is pleased when His people show Him gratitude and devotion.

Rio-Antirrio Bridge , Greece While on my trip to Greece in 2014 I took this picture on our trip across the Gulf. The tour guide told us the bridge was the third largest bridge of this type of construction in the world. The pylons with cable support construction was designed by a team of Greek and French architects. The originally started work on the design in the mid 90s, but they opened the bridge in August 2004. They did this one week before the Summer Olympics in Athens.
