



"But who can discern their own errors? Forgive my hidden faults." Psalm 19:12

Who would have thought that we need to repent of sins we don't even know we commit? Yet it is right there in God's word. As our Sunday School classes are combined for *The Bait of Satan*, God has exposed a sin in our church that many were not aware of: The sin of offense. Even as I write this, I risk offending. I challenge all of us (those who are earnestly and sincerely seeking God first), to look within and not at others.

Isn't it also interesting how the enemy can make things that were not an issue, an issue when you are studying them? I have noticed in my own life that I am struggling more with what I am learning in this series than I was before it even started. I catch myself getting offended at the most insignificant things. Satan won't go down without a fight! But God has prepared us for this:

"Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." Ephesians 6:11-17
