Note from the Deacon

I was asked recently what the function of the church deacon is, so I wanted to do a brief overview:

The purpose of the deacon was to help with the spiritual needs of a growing church. To quickly summarize (Acts 6:1-7), as the church grew some widows felt neglected and overlooked. As these feelings increased, so did divisions. Yes, man has not changed; there were divisions in the church even back then.

Apostles neglected their time in the word and in prayer. The apostles then directed the brethren to choose 7 men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and full of wisdom to alleviate this problem. The qualifications of a deacon are elaborated on in 1st Timothy 3: 8 – 13.

In 1st Timothy 5, the Apostle Paul teaches Timothy to honor widows "who are widows indeed". However, the family unit is the first level of response to the widow. Paul tells Timothy to place the widows "on the list" if they meet requirements spelled out in 1st Timothy 5.

Isn't it wonderful that the word of God addresses such difficult subjects like this? (and so many more)

At Braddock, you have seen an increase in the function of the deacon. I have seen deacons among other things:

- 1) Communicate by phone email and text with their assigned families on birthdays, anniversaries and other milestones
- 2) Make food for needy families
- 3) Help move families from one home to another
- 4) Helping coordinate with families, receptions at the church for those Saints who go to be with the Lord
- 5) Visit the sick in the hospital or at home
- 6) Most importantly, letting those in the body of Christ know that God is for them, by praying for and with them during those difficult times that inevitably come to us all.

Are all of above functions mandated by the word? I would say not. But the Lord is very gracious to us at Braddock. Are deacons perfect and accomplish all these functions perfectly.....NO. But when the chips are down, will your church come along side you when you have a need and you reach out to your deacon with a need? Absolutely YES! I thank God for the rich tradition of deacon service here at Braddock and all of the deacons who have served the body of Christ so well. Thank you Deacons!
