Note from the Senior Pastor

Let's take another look at who we are and what it is that we're about!

Moto: Seeking God, and Serving Others

Vision: The vision of Braddock Baptist Church is to continue to grow in our love with the triune (three in one) God: The Father, Son and Holy Spirit, by building ourselves up in the most holy faith, and to influence our community and the world with the message of Jesus Christ. This vision will guide every element of our ministry, here at BBC. In Romans 1:16, 17 Paul says, 16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. 17 For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith." At B.B.C., we believe that a relationship with Jesus Christ is the only thing that can transform a person's life. Our church is unashamedly dedicated to presenting this message in various ways and through many venues so that every person in our community and around the world, under our influence, is given a chance to understand it and come to salvation by faith.

Mission: We are Seeking God, diligently, and Serving Others, earnestly, and trusting the Lord to give the increase steadily, as we follow Him in the work He is doing. Jesus said that the greatest commandment is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength". Therefore, the answer to; "What is our mission?" we simply say "To love God whole heartedly" and "to let the expression of the love of God be in serving one another. Jesus also said that the Father is always at work, and he too is working, and we at B.B.C., have come to understand that when we see the Father at work, that is our invitation to join him. We are to complete the good work he has prepared in advance for us to do and in doing so, we bring glory to His most excellent name. Finally, we find in His word that in our work, some are to plant; others water, but it is through God we can count upon to see growth. This is the natural state of the Kingdom. When things are properly aligned, we seek first and then God adds everything else needed. Our desire, through our obedience to His initiating of love, is that his kingdom will continue to grow, and our Fathers house will be full.

Goals: I wish to add to our long-established Vision and Mission statement our Goals: in 2 Peter 1 it talks about adding to our faith. God has given believers "divine power", to receive divine and precious (valuable) promises, so we can participate in his "divine nature", which allows us to escape the corruption of this world caused by our evil desires. So, while in earnest prayer the other day and thinking about 2 Peter 1, I enquired of the Lord as to help me set goals for us here at this Bible Believing Community as to how to add to our faith and congregation. And what I believe the Lord showed me I wish to share with you. It comes in the form of three "D's" also.

Divine Drawing:

The scripture tells us that if we lift up Jesus, he will draw people to himself. Jn. 12: 32 And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me. 33 This he said, signifying what death he should die. Lifting up Jesus, is to elevate one's understanding of who he is, what it he has done and what is the result of his work. As we hoist an individual's understanding of Jesus'; death, resurrection, ascension, return policy and how he will rule, this will draw men to him. We need to be prepared to explain the purpose behind his death, resurrection and ascension. What was gained by these, and then use his return policy (I will come back for my own) as a motivation to make a discussion to follow him now, and the fact he will someday reign, benevolently, that is in such a way that the good of all is the truly realized.

Devine Discipling:

This disciple is like that which an athlete undergoes to get his or her very best performance. Peter speaks to receiving all that we need for life and godliness. This

is achieved by our understanding of Him: His character, nature, actions and motivations. As we keep our eyes fixed upon Him we find how then we too ought to live our lives. And by his divine power, he promises that we can participate in his divine nature.


Divine Dispatching:

This is the goal of fulfilling our generations' part in the great commission. Vs. 8 tells us that if we possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep us from being unproductive. We will bear fruitful, after His kind! The passage concerning adding to our faith these disciplines in ever increasing measure is a statement that we must remain in the vine. By our connection to the vine we too will produce good fruit!

We need to be drawing seekers to Christ, moving seekers to discipleship, and dispatching disciples to being soul winners. The scriptures tell us that wise men win souls. Let's all pray for this kind of wisdom!!! Amen! Our Vision: We must not allow our lives to get the way of our Christianity; we must live our lives in the context of our faith and walk with Christ as people who were designed with a purpose. Christ-likeness must infiltrate every aspect of our existence: the way we conduct our business affairs, the relationships we have with friends, neighbors, spouses and children. Our belief must rise to the level of life style and choice. Our vision for BBC is for us to be unified to level of understanding that there is only one race, the human race, and two physical kinds of humans; male and females and the two most significant statuses in which they find themselves, saved or sinners. And for us at Braddock Baptist Church, a truly Bible Believing Community, we are reminded regularly that saved people are not better than sinners, just better off for the eternal discussion they have made to follow Christ Jesus the Lord.

- 1) Final architectural plans are/have been submitted to Fairfax County for approval

- 4) Once downstairs is complete, upstairs sanctuary will take about 2 months to complete
